
We are on week 1 of the menu after half term. There are no changes to the menu for this week.

SPOTLIGHT ON PUPIL VOICE

Phew! What a busy term we have had as Eco Owls! Eco Owls have been organising an event, creating a new initiative for the school, presenting their ideas and holding whole school assemblies, to name just a few.

When the Eco Owls came back to school they were all really saddened by the terrible bush fires that they had seen happening in Australia. They came together and discussed what they could do to help. They decided the best way to help was to raise money in order to send to the WWF. Through their own enterprise they carried out a whole school assembly in order to inform staff and children of their idea: to have an Australian day where everyone wears green and yellow and donates a pound. On the actual day the children collected and counted the money. The school raised £151 and it is on its way to help the animals affected by the fires. We are so proud of the Eco Owls and how they are becoming globally aware citizens. The Eco Owls have also become aware of the food waste that seems to be making it into the schoolyard bins and not being composted. The children had a meeting and decided upon having a food waste recycling bin that could then be composted for the school garden. The children had a meeting with Miss Price, where they presented their idea and informed her of how they were going to run and fund the initiative. They also had a meeting with Mrs Stephens to discuss how the waste could be used for the school gardening compost bins. The children have been using all their skills in order to create timetables and rotas, posters to inform the children and staff and ICT to present an assembly. The Eco Owls have blown me away with their enterprising skills in order to find the project. I am so proud of all the children involved. The initiative will begin next term. As you can see, the Eco Owls have been enterprising and independent global citizens. Their voices are making a creative difference to Llangan Primary.
